Crime Overview

This section looks at the crimes of public interest that have occurred on the Rugby Rural Central Safer Neighbourhood Team policing area. Below is a brief summary of some of the incidents that have been reported to us in the month of June:

Appeals News and Updates/Information and Advice

Rugby man found guilty of robbery where pensioner was badly injured

A man from Long Lawford has been sentenced to five years in prison after being found guilty of a robbery in Long Lawford. Sean Ryan, aged 24, of Holbrook Road, Rugby pleaded not guilty to the offence. The incident involved a 79-year-old woman, who was badly injured and had her handbag stolen in Cross Street, Long Lawford on December 19 2015. Following a three day trial at Coventry Crown Court, Ryan was found guilty of the robbery as well as four counts of burglary in Coventry. He was sentenced to two years in prison for one of the burglaries and 18 months for each of the other three. The burglary sentences are to run concurrently with each other and consecutively with the robbery offence, making a total of seven years in prison.

Temporary Det Con Sean Whittaker, of Rugby CID, said: "Special thanks must go to out to the local community in Long Lawford who came forward and assisted police in the investigation and helped us to secure a conviction."

- S Strong passwords are nonsensical and made up of a mixture of letters, numbers and punctuation.

- R Remember to shred documents containing personal details before throwing away.
- T Think scams. If an online bargain seems to good to be true it probably is.

How to prevent number plate theft

With a report of number plate theft in the area we have decided that we should make you aware of how you can 'Secure your plates, and protect your identity'

Your car number plate is unique and is linked to the registered keeper of the vehicle. If your plates are stolen and used, thieves are stealing your identity. Being a victim of number plate theft is serious and you need to report it. The plates could be used to commit criminal offences and the police could be knocking at your door. Criminals use stolen plates for a whole host of reasons and sometimes in very serious crimes.

To avoid becoming a victim of number plate theft, we recommend taking the following actions:

- Park in a well lit area and use car parks that are accredited to the Secure Car Park Scheme.
- Fit non-returnable screws to your number plate, or another fixing device such as an epoxy adhesive. These are available from car parts supply shops and some DIY stores. *please see attached picture
- Purchase theft resistant number plates from a reputable dealer and ensure they adhere to British Standard BSAU 145d.

PCSO recovers car believed to be used in crime PCSO Havelock was alerted to a car that had been outside the informant's property for a period of time. On investigation PCSO Havelock found anomaly's with the vehicle. He suspected that this vehicle had been used in crime and not the vehicle matching the number plates. The vehicle was then recovered for further examination.

Vehicle seized in Ryton on Dunsmore for No Insurance & No Tax

PCSO Matt Havelock was on patrols in Ryton on Dunsmore when a car travelling in the opposite direction caught his attention. PCSO Havelock decided to turn around and check the vehicle. As it saw the police vehicle it darted into to a near by car park. When the vehicle was stopped it was found the vehicle had no insurance, no tax and a defective tyre. The vehicle was seized under 165 of the road traffic act for no insurance and will be reported for the other offences.
