Crime Overview

This section looks at the crimes of public interest that have occurred on the Rugby Rural Central Safer Neighbourhood Team policing area. Below is a brief summary of some of the incidents that have been reported to us in the month of August:

Anti Social Behaviour – There have been 19 separate reports of ASB in the Rugby Rural Central area.

Dead? Or Dead Slow?

Warwickshire police have started to work with the British Horse Society to help promote their latest campaign, dead? Or dead. The campaign has been designed to highlight safety of passing horses on the road. The BHS have also created an online near miss reporting page on their website which can be found on www.BHS.org.uk. Below are a few tips for passing horses

- Slow down to 15mph
- Be patient, don’t sound your horn or rev your engine.
- Pass horse wide (at least a car’s width)
- Drive slowly away



Priorities

New Policing priorities have been set for the Rugby Rural Central Team at July's Community Forum. The three priorities set are;

1. Parking Issues in Long Lawford - Due to ongoing issues with illegal parking and inconsiderate parking on roads in Long Lawford. The team will conduct a minimum of 15-targeted patrols to reduce issues and identify offenders.
2. Speed Enforcement - Leamington Road, Ryton on Dunsmore - Speeding motorist on the Leamington Road, Ryton on Dunsmore. Due to ongoing concerns from local residents it was agreed that regular speed checks and calming patrols would be conducted along Leamington Road, Ryton on Dunsmore in an attempt to reduce speeding, promote safety and identify offences. A minimum of 5 patrols will be completed to reduce issues and identify offenders.
3. Parking Issues in Binley Woods - Due to ongoing issues with illegal parking and inconsiderate parking on roads in Binley Woods. The team will conduct a minimum of 15-targeted patrols to reduce issues and identify offenders.

Although these are currently the main SNT priorities, we will continue to monitor any issues that have been raised previously.

News Stories

Off Road Driving Course for SNT Officers



PCSO Havelock and PC Graham from Rugby SNT were sent on an off road driving course on the 9th August 2016. The team have recently been equipped with a Ford Kuga AWD vehicle. The vehicle was purchased so they can reach our harder to reach communities and to better equip the team in adverse weather conditions which played dividends later in the month when the borough suffered from a torrential downpour.

Vehicle Seized in Ryton on Dunsmore

PC Stamp and PCSO Havelock were on patrols of Wolston and Ryton on Dunsmore when a vehicle passing caught their attention. The team PNC'ed the vehicle on the national police database and found the Van to have no Insurance, No Tax and finally no MOT. The Van was seized.



Superintendent Gardner visits Binley Woods Supported Village

Superintendent Gardner visited Binley Woods on Thursday 25th August 2016 to present the village with the signage for the supported village. This was following a number of successful "Property Marking" events in the village conducted by the police. Binley Woods have now become part of WCC's Supported Village Scheme, the first village to do so in the Rugby area.

As part of this scheme we have now installed three "Thieves Beware" notices, one at each end of the village on the Binley Woods signs and one by the shops in Woodlands Rd. whilst we accept that any such initiative will not eradicate theft and burglary, we hope that these signs will act as a deterrent.



To continue with the property marking initiative, the scheme has donated to the parish council a property marking kit and supporting literature. In future, the Parish Council will offer a property marking service for households and initially we will be providing this service at the village hall for 30 minutes each month from 19:00hrs, prior to the Parish Council meetings (next meeting 7th September).

Most household items can be marked, including bikes and gardening equipment, tools and computers, phones and tablets etc. Just bring them along.

For those that are less able, contact one of your parish councillors and we will arrange a house visit.

For businesses and trades people who may have a large inventory of goods that may require marking, again contact one of your parish councillors and we will make arrangements for you.

Vehicle Seized in Long Lawford

Whilst on parking patrols in Long Lawford the Rugby Rural Central team spotted a vehicle that raised concerns. The team stopped a vehicle on Back Lane, Long Lawford. The vehicle was checked on the Police National Computer and found that the car had no Insurance. The car was seized and the driver will be reported for driving offences.
