Lent jars in aid of WaterAid

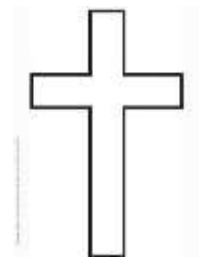
The total contributed to our Lent Jars initiative in support of the charity WaterAid was £453. 54.

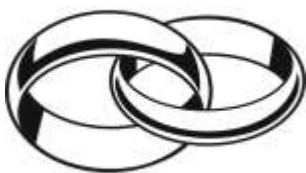
